Street Lighting in Chichester - Hours of Operation (Public Consultation)

Street lighting hours of operation – What do you think ?

West Sussex County Council have asked Chichester City Council to consult with local residents about the hours of operation of street lighting in the City.

Street lights are presently left on all night. Should lighting hours in residential areas return to 'part night' where the lights are turned off around midnight and then turned on for few hours in the early morning ?

Please note it would not be possible to have an all night and part night lighting applying in the same road.

However, all night lighting would continue to be applied across the City Centre within the City Walls, main roads in and out of the City plus feeder and link roads, in and around industrial areas, the railway station, police station, fire station and hospital.

West Sussex County Council have produced a briefing paper about this subject which sets out the detail of the proposal and a list of roads showing the part night proposals and those roads where all night (dimmed) lighting is proposed. These can be downloaded from the City Council's website www.chichestercity.gov.uk or a copy can be viewed at the Council House Reception.

Your views are very important, so please let us know by writing to Chichester City Council or submitting your comments via the City Council's website.

It would be helpful if you could state which road you live in when submitting your comments.

All comments need to be received by Monday 1 September 2014 as the matter will be considered at the City Council Meeting on Wednesday 10 September at 6pm
