Brewery Field Community Open Day

On 20 August 2017 a community open day was held in celebration of Brewery Field; the Mayor and Mayoress of Chichester opened the event.

The Field is a 'community' field and is maintained by the City Council on a long lease from West Sussex County Council. The Brewery Field can be found behind the car park at the back of the Records Office in Orchard Street.

War Memorial

The City Council has been successful in receiving a grant of £19,260 from the War Memorial Trust towards the approved programme of works to the War Memorial; this represents 75% of the overall project cost.

The statue of the poet John Keats sitting on a bench in Eastgate Square was unveiled by Dame Patricia Routledge in August.

The Deputy Mayor, Councillor Martyn Bell and Vincent Gray, the sculptor of the statue, were also at the unveiling ceremony.

The project had taken around three years to complete with funding from public donations, Goodwood, Chichester District Council and Chichester City Council.

The statue will be maintained by Chichester City Council.
