3. ICE RINK IN PRIORY PARK

Motions from the Mayor of Chichester, Councillor Martyn Bell :

- (i) The City Council's Planning Delegation Sub-Committee on 10 October 2018 raised no objection to the planning application based on the facts before them. However, as there is now a proposal to serve alcohol, this suggests greater evening usage and additional noise disturbance and these issues will need to be considered very carefully by the District Council. This is doubly important considering the disturbance and nuisance caused to near neighbours by the Oktoberfest weekend.

In the light of the additional information about the alcohol licence that was not before the City Council when a recommendation was made on the planning application, the City Council now strongly urges the District Council to examine an alternative location for the ice rink.

- (ii) Should the District Council decide to proceed with the ice rink in Priory Park, the daily operating hours of the ice rink should reflect this being a facility in use predominantly by families and young people and the promoter should not therefore be issued with a Licence to Retail Alcohol inside the rink or adjacent to the rink.

4. COMMON SEAL
