

Fly Tipping

It is NOT acceptable to dump waste of any kind on communal areas, other plots or unused ground. Not only is this anti-social, it costs the City Council a significant amount of money and is directly against the City Council's rules and the spirit of the allotment movement.

Therefore, anyone found fly tipping will be IMMEDIATELY evicted from their plot and any costs of clearing up recovered from the offending person.



Florence Road Site

For administration purposes the plots on the large part of the site will now be known as Blackberry Lane allotments. The small site immediately on Florence Road will retain the name Florence Road allotments.

The next formal plot inspections will be carried out week commencing 13th May 2019.

Discouraging Rats



- This is everybody's responsibility
- Turn the contents of your compost bin regularly
- Compost bins should have a wire mesh lining or placed on a paving slab
- Regularly kick your compost bin so its not a peaceful place to sleep
- No household waste is to be put on a compost bin, i.e. cooked foods, meat, bones etc
- Harvest ripe fruit and vegetables promptly
- Do not discard fruit and vegetables on the ground, clear them to the compost
- Keep your plot tidy so there is no cover to live in
- Regularly check sheds and greenhouses
- Store seeds, bulbs etc in rodent proof containers

Rats urinate wherever they go therefore, hands and food should be washed thoroughly as rats carry a risk of Weil's disease, Salmonella and Leptospirosis.
