


Q1 Should Chichester have a nightclub?


Q2 Are there too many cafes in the city centre?







Q6 Would you support more temporary uses or outdoor events within the City?





Q7 What did you think about the temporary Christmas ice rink?









Q11 Along the northern entrance to the City, in the Lavant Road area, should sub-division of large houses into smaller flats and houses be encouraged?





Q12 Should there be more cycle lanes provided for new housing areas?





Q13 Should new housing have environmentally friendly features e.g. solar panels and electric car recharging points?











Q20 Do you consider yourself to have a disability?


