Chichester West

Here is a brief roundup of issues I've been dealing with:

- Multiple issues with neighbour disputes and garden problems with both social housing and private rented tenants who are finding it extremely difficult to get any action or resolution. Issues include trespass, threatening behaviour and land disputes. I continue to support and advise these tenants to find solutions.
- I've had two calls about neighbour disputes from people that live outside of my area.
 Although I haven't been able to get involved directly, I was able to give advice as to the best way to go about contacting various agencies that can help.
- The Parklands Pantry initiative with UK Harvest goes from strength to strength with approximately 60 residents attending each week. The first few weeks of the school holidays we had over 80 people attending. It is also a good way for regular interaction to give help and advice with any issues. I'm pleased to say that we have had representation from a Hyde Benefits Advisor on a couple of occasions which has been very helpful for people struggling financially.
- Anti-social behaviour in various locations and I continue to encourage residents to report information to Police.
- Fly tipping in a couple of roads, still awaiting collection by Hyde that I have been reporting for many months.
- Some incidents of graffiti and faulty street lights.
- Attended various community events including Stonepillow, Revelation Church fun day and a Parklands Jubilee fun day in conjunction with Chichester Baptist Church.
- Numerous issues around cats and dogs, advice given.
- Some incidents of noise nuisance at weekends during the warm weather as people socialise outdoors.
- Welfare checks on elderly/vulnerable residents.
