Request for Removal of 2 x Phone Boxes at East Street, Chichester

Dear Sir

I am writing to request if it would be possible to remove telephone boxes (01243) 773381 and (01243) 531419, located outside of Superdrug, 80 East Street, Chichester, West Sussex, PO19 1HA.

The City Council have received complaints from local residents that the telephone boxes are being used as public urinals, as flyposting and unlicensed advertising sites and to store bedding and other belongings for members of the homeless community.

If it is not feasible to remove the telephone boxes, I would be grateful if you could advise what additional measures BT could put in place the limit the opportunity for antisocial behaviour and ensure that they are used for their intended purpose; for example, removal of the vinyl advertising wraps on the telephone boxes would ensure high visibility when they are being used for illegal purposes and hopefully limit their attractiveness as public conveniences.

At present, it is not possible to see what is happening inside the telephone boxes, rendering local CCTV coverage ineffective in both deterring and recording such behaviour. If the boxes must be retained, it is essential that they are returned to clear glass on all sides.

I would be grateful if you could advise me of what will be possible and how BT plan to address these problems, which are making life very difficult for the many nearby residents.

Key issues:

- The application is for a detached two-bedroom annex in the rear garden of an existing dwelling.
- The annexe would feature two bedrooms, a bathroom and a kitchen lounge.
- The building would be of a significant scale, approximately 6.5m by 7.5m and 3.2m in height.
- The building would feature a flat roof and would be finished in fibre cement cladding, the colour and general appearance of which has not been further specified.
- Although the area does feature a number of domestic outbuildings, the scale and design of the building would not be characteristic of the immediate area.
- The site is surrounded by neighbouring gardens and would be close to the boundary on three sides.
- Use of the annex would be ancillary to the dwelling; access is pedestrian only and via a side path adjacent to the dwelling.
- The two bedrooms feature large windows set to a height and position which would enable them to overlook the rear boundary, however, an existing outbuilding in the garden to the rear would mitigate the impact upon privacy and amenity as well as the overbearing impact to this neighbour, for as long as it remains in place.
- There would be an overbearing impact on the neighbours to the side.

Recommendation: Concern is raised over the overbearing impact upon the neighbours, due to the height, mass, scale and proximity of the development to the neighbouring boundaries, and due to the size and position of the bedroom windows. Reducing the scale of the development, particularly the height, would reduce the impact. If the LPA is minded to permit the application, a condition should be imposed ensuring it would only be used for purposes incidental or ancillary to the main dwellinghouse.


